I had no idea this was an option. I "Googled" Columbia, SC Police Department, and on the home page was the "File a Police Report" option. I clicked and followed the instructions to fill out the report. There were a few questions that I had to look up the information to provide (VIN#, license plate number, etc.) but after a few clicks, I submitted the report. Within a few minutes, I was notified my report had been accepted and filed. Within the hour I was contacted for a little more information, but that was it!

So simple and most importantly, the police got the information. No matter how small you might think a crime may be, contact the police and file a report! They want to know!

Security Camera Database

I serve as your Chair for the Cottontown Crime Prevention Committee along with Donna Green and Mark Dorey. As you have seen from our last post on Facebook, crime in our surrounding area is not going down. The Crime Prevention Committee would like to create a database of residents who: 1. Have security cameras on their property and 2. Are willing to share this information with the Columbia Police Department. The purpose behind the database is to help the CPD apprehend those responsible for crimes in our areas. I have had several conversations with many members of the CPD and they are looking forward to us sharing this information.

This is how it will work. If you are interested, please reach out to me with your name, address and cell phone number. We will keep everything confidential until it is needed by the CPD. If a crime has been committed near your address, by your participation, you are agreeing to have the CPD reach out to you for your footage. That is all.
